SENATOR HALL: Okay, thank you, Senator Schmit. I...it's difficult to stand up and argue against the proposal if you use the alfalfa dehydrators as the example, because those folks did get hit crossways when we changed not only their personal property to real property, in terms of their operations, and then threw the energy tax on top. The problem is that it's difficult to vote for this not knowing what the fiscal impact, although I do probably tend to agree with Senator Schmit that it's probably less than half a million dollars. I just, I mean I'm going to let...I'm not going to try to influence what you do on this because it's...I don't know, maybe it will be a million and a half. But do what you want with this amendment, I just am not sure. I guess I'm going to probably just vote no on it, just to be stubborn. But I can understand the argument, especially if you use the argument of the alfalfa dryers, because they did get hit probably more than any one entity when we changed provisions, not only in the definition of real estate, but in terms of personal property and then the tax on the energy. So, with that, I'm going to oppose the amendment and I would urge you to think about it.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I'd rise to oppose the amendment, too. And I have no disagreement with the comments that Senator Hall has made as a general policy. But the absence of really any firm figure what the real impact could be, I'd be hesitant to adopt it at this time.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. Does...Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Well, Madam President, and members, maybe I need to ask Senator Schmit a question. I understand we don't know what it costs. But I want to talk about the policy for a second. It's my understanding that this amendment would basically...the cap was put in to protect Nucor. Maybe I'll address my question to Senator Hall, so he can...Is that fair to say the cap was in there to address Nucor's problem?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Moore, we put a cap in, not necessarily to address Nucor in particular, but to address large energy users, and not to...they were used as an...
