

reconsideration motion on my amendment, obviously I couldn't. But the facts are that I went down through the tally and I find eight individuals who will, at some time or other in the next few months, be able to explain to their constituents that the Legislature imposed an unfair tax upon them, and hopefully that constituent will not take the trouble of researching to determine how that legislator voted. I find it inconceivable that anyone who lives in the Platte Valley, who has a constituency, as Senator Chambers has said, very small, no power, probably didn't even register to vote, certainly not active politically, could get whipsawed around with 1,000 percent or better tax increase. No one seems to care, no one seems to care. Why? No political clout. But just let the major elephant walk down the center isle and there seems to be all sorts of people that are concerned. I guess, Senator Hillman, I'm concerned that, you know, you, yourself, are concerned about this issue but not the other issue. I think that to be consistent you ought to be concerned about both. But more than that, I think, is that we ought to be concerned about those individuals who expect this body to look after their interests without having a lobbyist, without having someone looking over our shoulder, without having someone rattle our chain. And we fell four votes short. And there are at least eight legislators there who have a constituency out there who is going to be mistreated, I think, albeit unfairly as a result of not adopting an amendment which I'm sure has a much less adverse impact than this one. PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Schmit. Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Madam President and members of the body, I wasn't going to talk on this, but I thought that I probably should. I didn't vote for part B of the Hall amendment because I didn't quite understand it. Maybe not that it's that complicated, but we didn't have that much discussion about it, and I didn't know what questions to ask. Senator Hall, how many corporations will this affect by changing this? We know that it will affect Great West out in western Nebraska.

SENATOR HALL: It will affect every corporation.

SENATOR HEFNER: To how much?

SENATOR HALL: I don't think it will...well, some corporations it will affect more than others.
