this measure to pay for the bill, if rather it be done through deficit appropriation. I think the more prudent course is to appropriate the money up front. If you are uncomfortable with the dollar amount, go back and talk to the Department of Revenue. It is their number, so I am not going to sit here and try and defend it, but that's what the number is. Given that, I'd ask for adoption of the amendment then.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Moore. Does anyone wish to speak to this amendment? Seeing none, we will now vote on the Moore amendment. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay on adoption of the Select File amendment, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The amendment is adopted. I will recognize...is there anything further on the bill? Okay, Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the readvancement of LB 2 to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT MOUL: You heard the motion to advance. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. LB 2 is advanced. Do you have items for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Madam President, I have further motions. Senator Bernard-Stevens would move to return LB 1 to Select File for specific amendment. (Bernard-Stevens amendment appears on page 49 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam Chairman. Just very briefly, Senator Warner briefly tried to save us...I don't know if it has actually saved us time, actually, probably didn't in the long run, but tried to suspend the rules in order to have another amendment that would be adopted. The amendment...the motion fell one vote short. This is a process by which you return it from E & R for a specific amendment. It would be allowable under the rules and I ask we do so. And, again, the amendment that would be talked about would be the Warner amendment that was before us prior to that. A simple motion, those that want to speak, go at it.
