broken to achieve a specific purpose here today.' So I hope that you will vote to override the ruling by the Chair that this bill is at a different stage of debate than it was a very few minutes ago, when we were debating it at this stage of debate.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. I will recognize Senator Warner, followed by Senators Bernard-Stevens and Landis. Senator Warner. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam Chairman. Not to get pro...I believe we can each speak one time and that is it on motions to override the decision of the Chair. The only thing I would...I would bring out is I remember last sessions that we have had, we have had bills that were advanced, and the precedent was set, not by me but by the body, where bills were advanced to E & R, and in order to save time and the cost of expense of printing up a bill that we knew would have to be brought back for an amendment, we made the motions during those sessions to bring the bill back from E & R for a specific amendment. We have done that. The precedent has been set previously by this body where a bill is at E & R and, again, in order to save the cost of printing up a bill on Final Reading to which we were going to have to bring back, amend, and print up another bill, this body has in the past, and I suspect will continue to do, a motion that would return from E & R for a specific amendment. So this is not a new creation of a rule. This is not a breaking of the rule. This is simply following the precedent that we have already established. I might also want to add to the discussion that things in the special session are different. In fact, since I have been in the body, I think there has only been one time, one year where we have not had a special session. So as far as my family is concerned, there is nothing special about them at all. It is simply something that happens and there is still time between now and December or January 1st and we still could squeak in another one if we worked real hard at it. But the point being the following, in special sessions things happen differently, I don't need to explain that. We had General File on one hour of the morning, and then an hour and a half later in the afternoon, we are on Select File, and sometimes it may even be closer than that that we have discussions. There is no layover. There is no time to look. Things simply happen. It would be nice to be in a regular session, to come back tomorrow, come back the next day and say, by the way, there is a specific amendment, we would like to save some time and some effort, let's bring the bill
