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couldn't bring a bill back to Select File. I am not saying that if it was on E & R Final tomorrow and an attempt was made to bring it back that perhaps you would be in a position...you wouldn't be in a position where you could make this motion. There are places in the rule book where it specifically says that you cannot make certain motions more than one time on the same day at the same stage of debate. And it says, I believe, at the same stage of debate contemplating the possibility that a bill on that same day may move from General File to Select File. Therefore, on the same day it is at a different stage of debate. That's the crucial point, the same stage of debate on the same day. We are at the same stage of debate on the same day without anything having been done on this bill. It has not left the custody of the Legislature in a physical way by being delivered to E & R Final. So it certainly...

PRESIDENT MOUL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...could not be considered to have been acted on. I hope that there will be enough votes to overrule the Chair. In this instance, I think the integrity of our rules is more important than whatever issue on this bill might be, or how any of us might feel on the bill. I have other days and other times when I can attack the bill, if that is what I choose to do. But this is a matter of whether our rules are to be complied with. It is an attempt to reconsider after reconsideration has failed twice, but the rules were suspended at the same stage of debate on the same day more than one time, and I think our rules don't allow that. So I am asking that we vote to overrule the Chair.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Does anyone else wish to speak to the motion? Seeing none, do you have closing, Senator Chambers? That was your closing, okay. We will now vote on the motion to overrule the Chair. All those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How many votes does it take for this motion to carry with what we actually have on record as being here?

PRESIDENT MOUL: It is 20 votes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I am going to ask for a call of the house.
