that year, there would be no surtax, am I correct? It says 10 million worth of sales throughout the country, but in the State of Nebraska, we are on the property example, there are no new buildings built, there would be no surtax, am I correct? No depreciation in Nebraska.

SENATOR HALL: If they would have no depreciation in Nebraska, that would be correct.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Robinson. Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: If I understood Senator Robinson's question correctly to Senator Hall was that if there were no new buildings built in year 1992, there would be no depreciation. Well, what about the buildings that had been put up prior to that and were still on the depreciation schedule? Help me out.

SENATOR HALL: Madam President, members, Senator Nelson, in response to your question, it wouldn't have to be buildings built in the year that this bill was passed, it could be any prior depreciation...any depreciation that the multistate, multinational corporation would be using would, in Nebraska, that had its origin in Nebraska, would be factored into the formula. So, it would not have to be only new buildings. It would be any depreciation left on a building, under your example, that was built, for example, three years prior and was on a seven year table.

SENATOR NELSON: That's what I thought. Well, buildings are 27 1/2 years usually or 30, but I just wanted to clarify it because I thought Senator Robinson's question was that if it just wasn't built in 1992, and I had that question, and, Senator Hall, I really appreciate, the way I know you feel and sound, stand in here and hang in.

SENATOR HALL: Well, I am not going anywhere.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Nelson. Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Madam President and members of the body, another question for you, Senator Hall.
