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situations and to attempt to address those with as much alacrity as possible, as well as to anticipate situations that might arise due to defects that may be in our rules that have gone unnoticed. With that, I would pledge to you to continue the work that we've been doing as the Rules Committee, and would hope for your support for this position.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Will. Are there any further nominations? Motion is that nominations close and Senator Will be elected by acclamation. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed nay. Senator Will is the Chair of the Rules Committee. Congratulations, Senator Will. The Enrollment and Review Committee. Senator McKenzie.

SENATOR MCKENZIE: Madam President and members of the body, it is my honor and I believe tradition for the outgoing E & R Chairman to make the nomination for the new youngest freshman member for E & R Enrollment for the 94th session. It's my pleasure to nominate Senator Maurstad to be E & R this year. And I would believe, as in Senator Hall's manner, we could move to close nominations and proclaim Senator Maurstad E & R Chairman by acclamation.
