PRESIDENT ROBAK: The motion is that the report is accepted. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed nay. The motion is...the report is accepted. We now turn to Item 19. Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, Madam Chair, members of the body, before I make the motion, a couple of comments on this. Tomorrow, at two o'clock...the motion will be to arrange to hold the inaugural ceremonies for the newly elected state officials on Thursday, January 5, 1995, at two o'clock p.m., here in this Chamber. As we make the motion to adjourn, I am going to allow the body to make its determination as to how we handle tomorrow's schedule. Tomorrow will be a fairly light day. As a matter of fact, there really are no functions on the agenda other than the inauguration and the introduction of new bills. Now the introduction of new bills doesn't take us, as individual members, very long, but it takes a while for the Clerk's Office to read all of those into the record and process them. Normally, we recess or we adjourn today until 10:00 a.m. the second day. We will then introduce new bills and we will reconvene at approximately one-thirty for the purpose of holding the inaugural ceremony at two. If the body would prefer to wait and come in until about noon, take a couple of extra hours in the morning to do other things, do our bill introductions from noon, and then do the inaugural ceremony after that, that's perfectly acceptable. So when we get to the motion for adjournment we'll put those two options to a vote. At this point, though, I am making the motion for the inaugural ceremonies. Also be advised that there will be a number of senators who will be asked to participate as escorts for the various elected officials who will be...being inaugurated. We'll get a list of those around, we'll be checking with your offices to make sure that you're willing to participate in those and we'll be getting that list out a little later on today. So, at this point I move to arrange to hold the inaugural ceremonies for the newly elected state officials on Thursday, January 5, 1995 at two o'clock p.m.
