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senator's name onward we proceed in alphabetical order. Or if you please, alphabet the "letical" order.

SENATOR WILL: I guess, Senator Chambers, I would...I would argue that the term alphabetical implies starting at the beginning of the alphabet. And I think we can make it clear, at least my intent, I think, is being made clear at this time as I explained what my understanding of the rule would be, and that is that we would start at the beginning of the alphabet or at the end of the alphabet when a roll call vote is taken, as the rule describes the methodology. So I would hope that the fact that this is being put in the record now would make it clear for any subsequent individual that's in the Chair, that that is the intent of the rule.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Will. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, members of the body. Senator Will, I must admit to a preference to Senator Chambers' point of view. And my only thought is that, for your consideration, is five, ten years down the line when most of us are not here, there's not going to be a whole lot of people go back and reread the record as to what alphabetical means. Quite honestly, I think you could start with Senator Kristensen and go alphabetically. And just so that...you know how we get into these rules fights that we know what it says specifically and we take a literal interpretation, and those of us that are here say, yes, but we know the intent, so that's what we do. Later on down the line people may not remember what the intent is, but they look at what the rule actually says. I think we need to be cognizant if the rule simply says needs to go alphabetically. It does not necessarily mean...I know this is a silly discussion because on the scheme of things it's not that important, but the rule...this simply says alphabetically. If we're going to be technical on the rules so there's no misinterpretation, I suggest you make the simple change and say starting at the beginning and there would be no problems in the future.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Is there any further discussion regarding proposed rule change number four? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Will a question.
