CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of amendment number five.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Amendment five is adopted. Senator Beutler, do you have a question before amendment six? Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. Proposed rule change six was also brought by the Rules Committee, and this may be the most technical amendment at all. This was brought at the suggestion of the Legislative Research Division. Basically, we right now, Rule 4, Section 3(h) specifies that seven copies of each completed Standing Committee is filed with the Legislative Reference Library. Apparently, Legislative Reference Library has a procedure that they go through with each Standing Committee Report where various copies are distributed to various record-keeping agencies. And at this point seven is not enough, they have to make a couple additional copies of each, and they simply suggest that if we required nine copies to be filed, as opposed to seven, that it would make their job a little easier. I would ask for your support for this.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any discussion on proposed rule change number six? Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Madam President. A question of Senator Will, if he would.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Yes.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Senator Will, you kind of peaked my curiosity. These copies in the Legislative Reference Library are sent to whom?

SENATOR WILL: They're...they distribute nine copies, one is retained by the Legislative Reference Library to have on hand here, four go to the Nebraska Library Commission, two to the National Conference of State Legislatures, and two to the Council of State Governments.
