to what the body is doing. I'm going to repeat again this morning what I have said before and I will say it as the session wears on and we get into rules fights, I don't care what rule you adopt. I don't care what form any rule takes. All I need to know is what is the rule and I will find a way within the rules to do what I think needs to be done, but the rest of you who don't pay attention to the rules, who don't have that facility, are the ones who, like a little fly on fly paper, will take a step to the left and one of your six legs is caught. You take a step to the right and your right front leg is caught. You take another step to the left with your middle leg and that's caught; a step to the right and the right middle leg, then you do it until all six of your little legs are caught in the flypaper and you cannot extricate yourself and you're right where I want you. The rule that you put in place, that you say the Legislature should be in conformity with, will be the thing that traps you while doing nothing to me except playing into my hands.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if you adopt Senator Withem's amendment, you make it possible to sort out those parts of a multifaceted amendment which is amenable to a division of the question motion and allow them to be dealt with on their merits individually. And if, under the germaneness rule, that component could not stand on its own merit, it would be ruled out of order by the Chair and eliminated from the table. Although, if the Chair so ruled, an attempt could be made to overrule the Chair. If the Chair ruled that that component is germane, the same motion to overrule the Chair could be made. So what we're really talking about is not germaneness or nongermaneness but how many other types of motions will be made and how...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...much time will be consumed dealing with them.
