Senator Preister, Senator Wesely. We are voting on a motion to suspend the rules to allow public hearing by General Affairs Committee next Monday. Call-in votes have been authorized.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Bernard-Stevens voting yes. Senator Janssen voting yes. Senator Day voting yes. Senator Cudaback voting yes.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays to suspend the rules, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Motion does pass, the rules are suspended.
