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complicated bill and going back into some back room somewhere, talking to a group of people, even though I know this does occur, having this happen as a matter of rules, having an individual go into a room back somewhere and discussing what should be done from that point on. To me, first of all, I don't like it not happening on the floor of the Legislature. I think at least all of us can know exactly what's happening with a bill if we keep the process out here in the open and in front of all of us. And, second of all, I'm not sure that a freshman senator or any senator, many of us could...could withstand possibly that infusion of tremendous pressure from individuals. You're not going into the room with anyone, other than yourself, who is in favor of the bill. You're going into the room with individuals or, it says, one or however many of the individuals are opposed to the bill and have slapped a bunch of amendments onto your bill and the Speaker. So I want you to consider carefully before you do adopt something like that, set this amendment into its actual practice and how you would be in this instance, and if you think that would help the process of getting your bill through, or if you think that would help the process of the Legislature. I resent Senator Chambers thinking that this is just Senator Chambers, an amendment for Senator Chambers. And I've heard you, you know, the past two years say the same thing. I think you kind of give yourself a little too much credit here, (laugh) and I hope you don't mind my saying so, but it seems to me that you say that just to convince all the rest of us that, oh yes, this is against Senator Chambers and we couldn't do anything like that. I...I look at this and I think this is...this would be very appropriate to a lot of the crime legislation that we've discussed on the floor and at times had tremendous pressures on the floor about. And so I feel like at some point it would involve myself in this. And so I want people to see this not as something directed at any individual, but possibly direct it at every individual and understand what would happen in the process. I do have to say, and I have to say it because I've gone through two years of listening to you, Senator Chambers, talk about the racism. This really has nothing to do...I think you got a real good group of people here to work with. And I think...you know, people come to me and they say, why do you let Senator Chambers or anybody else, they've mentioned several other senators actually, do something like that with the going on and on and on. And I say to those individuals, you know, that's part of the process. Those individuals don't know the rules any better, necessarily, although they'll contend that they do just to make all of us
