SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, here's what I am trying to point out, this rules change proposal is talking about...

SENATOR HALL: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I've been up 10 minutes?

SENATOR HALL: I'm sorry, Senator Chambers, my fault. I just sat down in the Chair and...please proceed.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And that's what happens when we have a change in the Chair, not just in timekeeping, but sometimes a difference in philosophy about how the rules will be interpreted. But here is what I am trying to show. When you talk about something being dilatory you are using a subjective term which has no definition and the definition will vary from time to time depending on the issue before us. But if your aim is to stop people from tying up the body, this rule change cannot do that. Let's say that Senator Lindsay and I are in cahoots and he wants to push hard for his bill but he's a good person and he's going to let anybody who thinks they have an amendment that's worthwhile offer that amendment. So I don't offer 30 amendments to my bill, I offer 30 amendments to a bill of Senator Lindsay's which means nothing to him because he's going to be able to lift the contents out of that bill and attach it to another one anyway. So it's a vehicle which can be used in that fashion and Senator Lindsay is not going to ask for a point of order to have any of those amendments declared dilatory. So if there is no declaration that the amendments are dilatory because the point of order is not raised, at what point is the Speaker going to feel comfortable saying, then I, on my own motion will take this senator's bill off the agenda because somebody else has added amendments and the senator is not willing to say that they're dilatory. These are the kinds of things you're going to put on the Speaker and require the Speaker to do and it means nothing to you all now, but I'm taking all this time and saying it because I want it in the record so when it happens and the Speaker's nerves get frayed and he says, I don't think you should put me in this bind, I'm just going to bring out the transcript, put my initials in the
