I think that maybe we have a system that disperses the power among the 49 elected officials and allows us each to represent the districts to the best of our judgment and to the best of our ability. I, too, would like a little bit more honesty in the process of selecting a chairman. But I think that by and large we know who voted for us and who didn't vote for us. I don't think that you have to be a real wizard to figure that out. My approach is always to tell a person if I know how I'm going to vote whether I'm going to be able to support them or not and why. But there are so many factors that go into this decision-making process, then I'm afraid if we chose your process it would definitely change the results of the elections and I don't think I want to do that. Having said that, there is one other thing that I would like to mention and I wasn't really aware of it on the day of the election until somebody pointed out to me, but, Senator Witek, you had in front of you large sheets of paper and you were writing the names of...

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...people that you were voting on and I appreciate your approach and that you were wanting to be open and honest about that, but I would caution the body that if we allow this kind of activity to occur on the floor of the Legislature, then this could actually be, in essence, a campaign for a certain chairman, for a certain person for Chairman. You were signalling in a sense to other members of the body how you were going to vote. Let's say that we had an organized group that was trying to effect the outcome of the chairmanship elections and we had somebody who was using placards, if you will, to signal how they were voting on certain chairmanships or even issues, if we got down to that. I would rather not have this kind of thing happening on the floor of the Legislature...
