

SENATOR COORDSEN: For the services.

SENATOR CROSBY: Yeah.

SENATOR COORDSEN: And the 4,000 would be...my question I guess was whether that would be sufficient to carry out the mandates of this bill or the request of this bill...

SENATOR CROSBY: Well, initially...

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...over the future.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...I think, initially it would and I never do say to you that this on any bill or any amount of money, I never say, well, this is it, we'll never spend any more because you know that's not true.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay. And the special advisory committee, I would understand, would receive no additional compensation, mileage, expenses or anything.

SENATOR CROSBY: No, that's right. These are people that are already in the...

SENATOR COORDSEN: These are all professionals out of the...

SENATOR CROSBY: They're already in the business, George.

SENATOR COORDSEN: I wanted to get that into the record...

SENATOR CROSBY: Right, right.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...because that's my interpretation...

SENATOR CROSBY: And they would work with the commission.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Crosby. I would have one question of Senator Pedersen, please, if he would respond.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Pedersen.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: Yes.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Since you're in counseling as a profession and run into problems and you indicated in your testimony some
