

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, well...

SENATOR CROSBY: Yeah, training but not...

SENATOR CROSBY: For me, a seminar is where a whole bunch of people come together to get educated or listen or whatever. I don't...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Another thing, now are there other disabilities that lack this service also? I could see blind people or other people with disabilities...

SENATOR CROSBY: Well, you heard what Senator Wesely said...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Let me finish, let me finish, let me finish. That...things like this...wait a minute, wait a minute...other disabilities, this bill will pass and they'll come back and say, well, we want the same thing as the hearing-impaired. Now I don't know whether we offer this type of service or not.

SENATOR CROSBY: Well, Senator Wesely mentioned that there is a whole division for the blind. The other thing is that there are other groups of people. Yes, as someone mentioned Hispanics and so on, but those people are not hard of hearing. So this commission has been charged with working with the hearing-impaired and trying to help them access what they need.

SENATOR ROBINSON: But you're not aware of whether we offer this to other disability groups. Is that correct?

SENATOR CROSBY: LB 830 brought in...attempted to bring in services for people with developmental disabilities which hasn't been completely implemented and funded and that covers a variety, as you know, of disabilities.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Do they have access to this type of service? Do you know?

SENATOR CROSBY: I'm sure they do, although people...I'll just
