SENATOR CROSBY: You mean an age requirement for the counselor?

SENATOR ROBINSON: No age requirement for the people that would receive this service.

SENATOR CROSBY: No, no, no. Children, adults, whatever.

SENATOR ROBINSON: I think Senator Beutler said there are eight people on the commission, is that correct? Are those all paid people?

SENATOR CROSBY: He's talking about the employees. Was he...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Not talking about the commission or...

SENATOR CROSBY: There's nine people on the commission and they are appointed by the Governor.

SENATOR ROBINSON: No, the people that work for the commission.
