SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Discussion?
Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker and members, I want to rise to support this bill. It's very important for towns like Stanton. We don't have any doctor in Stanton but we do have a P.A. that comes down once a week so he is able to give these physicals for our schools and it's very important that we have something like this, so I want to thank Senator Wesely and I sure support the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I wasn't going to say anything on the bill until Senator Schellpeper stood up and I mispredicted, in my mind, what he was going to say. I thought he was going to say we don't have any doctors in Stanton and we don't take American Express. (Laughter.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wesely to close on the motion to advance. Closing has been waived. The question is, shall LB 214 be advanced to E & R initial? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 214.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 214 is advanced. LB 26.

CLERK: LB 26 offered by Senator Warner. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 5 of this year, referred to the Revenue Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: There are no amendments. Senator Warner, you are recognized to open.
