

SENATOR HALL: Which I don't argue with.

SENATOR WARNER: ...yeah, which is becoming more and more of a necessity. Initially it's going to require some additional information.

SENATOR HALL: So in other words, the main thrust of the bill is basically to allow for the additional form, but also to guarantee that it will be kept confidential?

SENATOR WARNER: That was the concern initially and this is why it has the E clause to go into effect right away so that other changes the Legislature considers obviously aren't going to be enacted for some months and this is to give the immediate protection.

SENATOR HALL: Okay, thank you very much.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Hall. Senator Warner, there are no other lights on. Would you like to close? Don't even want to close. Okay, closing has been waived. The question then is the advancement of LB 135. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, please.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 135.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 268.

CLERK: LB 268, a bill by Senator Warner. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10, referred to Revenue, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, 268 is a cleanup bill. A year ago you recall the date for certifying budgets to (inaudible) by various governmental subdivisions which previously was September 1 was changed to September 20th. This section was inadvertently left out and so the bill as introduced strikes the provision for September 1. I should point out that we could have put in, did not put in as a committee amendment September 10th because there will in all likelihood be some other legislation that is going to adjust that date and when that date becomes clear it can be applicable to all these governmental subdivisions in one place rather than putting the date here and again may have to subsequently be
