Secondly, under something that says 2CA file because of the number from last year, you'll find a number of businesses, attorneys, organizations, labor unions, the state chamber, et cetera, who have endorsed the principle of the arbitration amendment and that's the other item that I've had placed on your desk. Madam President, I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote so that we can have the record vote that Senator Chambers asked for. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Landis. There has been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will all senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Beutler, Senator Bohlke, Senator Lynch, Senator Matzke, Senator McKenzie, Senator Coordsen, Senator Robinson, Senator Schrock, Senator Hartnett, Senator Hillman, Senator Wesely, Senator Jones. There has been a request for a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, please proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 459 of the Legislative Journal.) 39 ayes, 1 nay, Madam President, on the advancement of LR 1.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LR 1CA advances. LR 21CA. I raise the call.

CLERK: Madam President, LR 21CA was a resolution originally introduced by Senator Pirsch and a number of members. (Read summary.) The resolution was introduced on January 10 of this year, at that time referred to the Judiciary Committee. The resolution was advanced. I have no amendments to the resolution at this time, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Pirsch to open on LR 21CA.
