SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, let me ask you this question, Senator Schrock, since it was made an issue and his opponent did all he could to attack Senator Cudaback on it but Senator Cudaback won, couldn't I as logically conclude that they approved of Senator Cudaback's position, since they sent him back here again?

SENATOR SCHROCK: No, you can't because you didn't know Senator Cudaback's opponent.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, yes, I can. Thank you, Senator Schrock. Members of the Legislature, that is a logical conclusion, that knowing what his position was they nevertheless sent him back. See, the line has been drawn on this bill. And if you listen to the ones who have attacked it, this is where they're going to make their stand and teach the Legislature something. There are people who have spoken on this bill who have never spoken on this issue before, and the comments they offered were not productive in the sense of having knowledge or information. So, if they want to kill this bill, they can succeed in preventing it from moving, but they need to realize that we've got a long session. And some people getting bad advice in these early days and thinking that they're being advised by the geniuses of the Legislature, are going to find out that they're sitting on the outside looking in, as happened a couple of years ago when some did this, but they have learned and they've gotten out of that basket of ignorance and
