

five years or less seems to work and when you get above that I'm questioning whether, in fact, it would be actuarially sound. I think that's something you need to take into account and I guess at this point I'll support the bill but I think we need to probably take a look before it gets on further down the road to make sure that we're not getting ourselves into something that we will find is not as good as we had intended to be and so I will not support the kill motion at this time. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Chambers, you are recognized to close on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, despite what those have said who favor this, I'm going to go forth with the kill motion and I'm not going to support the bill. These kind of things can be purchased now. There is in existence a process used by the Game and Parks Commission which allows what is known as deniability for the Legislature. There is nothing in legislation as silly as this language that we have presented to us here today. Senator Beutler is in favor of the fund that this money will go into so he'd support almost anything that is not legal to get money in that fund because he supports what the fund is for and I don't think he would make any bones about that. But I'm a member of the Legislature and I want to put as much distance between myself and some of the foolish things the Legislature does as I possibly can. I wonder if somebody from the Game and Parks Commission came in here and said, Senator Beutler, from our experience we don't think there ought to be such a thing as a bicycle trail in Nebraska. Would Senator Beutler say, well, they have a good record. They have done good things, they're innovative, they know more about this than we do so we ought to accept what they're saying. No, he wouldn't because he has an interest in that subject and he is not going to defer his judgment to the Game and Parks Commission and let them make a determination for him. Read this language. This is silly. Who would stand up and be proud to talk to a group of college students about this? If you get your child this hunting license for life before he or she turns five, you can get it cheaper. They say, why would a Legislature even have to pass a law like that? This is the kind of thing which I oppose so much that if I believe in announcing curses that would work, I would curse the people in this Legislature who support this down to the
