

the corporation under this amendment if you ask for an extended time to file, you still would be required to file an estimate of your tax and pay it along with it, as you're all familiar, similar to what the federal government does. Inadvertently, the way the amendment was drafted it not only...it extended the ability to a corporation to ask for an extended period but it also would not have permitted, would not have required them to make the estimated payment. It is intended that they are to make the estimated payment as an individual does and the amendment strikes the provision so that a corporation would be treated just the same as an individual. They could ask for an extension for filing but they would need, in any event, to file an estimate of the tax at the time that they were asking for the extension and this would be true with an individual. If you're in error, why there is an interest payment, late payment on that case or if there is fraud involved in some fashion, you are subject to even more fines, but it is corrective and I move adoption.
