

to...to doing that. Depends on what you're towing with. If you have, let's say, a pickup or a car and you're towing something that obstructs the back of that vehicle, the general vehicle requirements are that you have to have your brake lights or taillights showing for turn signals and stopping brakes. Now, if you're towing it with a tractor, obviously, that doesn't occur, that's where your slow-moving vehicle signs occur because it just...the tractor physically can't...the implement of husbandry can't travel that fast and so that's a general warning that this is just a slow-moving vehicle, period. As a matter of course, for safety purposes or other reasons, they may put those slow-moving vehicle signs like on fertilizer tanks just as an added warning to do that. Most of the fertilizer tanks, obviously, aren't wide enough and don't block the back of a pickup or a car, if you're foolish enough to tow it with a car, but truck or whatever you have. So there's still the general requirements that you've got to be able to see turn signals and brake lights on a vehicle that would be equipped with them if you're towing them down the road. If you block that, for example, a horse trailer, you know, you're going to need a brake or a turn signal because you've probably obstructed the entire view of the back behind, where if you're towing the fertilizer tank with a tractor, you probably don't need those and that's where your slow-moving vehicle sign comes in. It's a matter of course. They just put those on there in case you're doing it with a tractor and not with a pickup. So you've still got those requirements and, I don't know, Senator Schmitt is my expert on lights but I...if he disagrees, I will let him put that on the record. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR JANSSEN: (Microphone not activated) ...but there's another thing that happens once in a while, they are bale racks, hayracks, and I'm sure .maybe Senator Schrock could answer this, on bale racks, you know what I'm talking about, do they...are they also required to have the slow-moving vehicle sign on those if they are pulling them down the road? Senator Kristensen and Senator Schrock are both shaking their heads in the affirmative. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.
