

All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 59.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 82, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 82 introduced by Senator Cudaback and others. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 5, referred to the Transportation Committee, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Transportation Committee, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: For the committee amendments, Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and members of the Legislature, LB 82 is a bill brought to us primarily by Senator Cudaback. I guess there are a number of other senators listed on here, but it does deal with the transportation and pulling of a museum piece or vehicles of historical significance, and I will let Senator Cudaback, in his opening, discuss with you what we're doing. But if you had a commercial vehicle or a plate, you would be allowed to transport these pieces from place to place. Since they're not your own, you can do them for commercial purposes and that's not a problem. What happens are we've got some volunteers or some people out there with farm plates who would be allowed to carry their own pieces but if they're volunteering and taking somebody else's piece, museum piece, to a public parade or to a museum or for a display of some kind that they needed the authorization to do that. This is a fairly narrow authorization but the committee felt that Senator Cudaback, when he presented it, talked about museum pieces, we also saw that vehicles were included that they may well be carrying or transporting on a trailer and so on. Just to make sure that we covered everything that Senator Cudaback wanted, the committee has added, after the words "museum pieces", "or vehicles of historical significance" just to make sure that museum pieces and vehicles were both included on this. I made a mistake in the committee statement. If you're looking, it should be page 4, line 10, not line 1, if you're following on the committee statement. So if you would correct that, you will find that it's on line 10 after the words "museum pieces", all we're doing is adding "or vehicles". And I still think that this complies with the intent of what Senator Cudaback wanted to
