SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. For discussion on the committee amendment, Senator Vrtiska, followed by Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body, could I ask Senator Kristensen a question, if I could, please?

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Your amendment indicated that you could drive an antique vehicle to a parade without a license. Is that right?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No, this is to carry or to pull it and put it on a trailer.

SENATOR VRTISKA: But you can't drive it?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, if you've got a vehicle that's got a legitimate plate on it, yes, and then that gets into the historical plates and those things.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Oh, okay, that's...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: This is not a historical plate bill, this is the authorization to transport, and I think Senator Cudaback...I don't know if he's passed any of those out, but it's got some of those museum pieces and things that they want to take and display them and just physically get them to the parade.

SENATOR VRTISKA: I understand that. I guess I misunderstood. I thought it meant that you could drive an antique vehicle but you need an antique plate or some type of a registration.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: You need a valid plate to...
