

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You've heard the closing on the Beutler amendment. All those supportive of the Beutler amendment vote yes, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The Beutler amendment is adopted. Any further amendments?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, Senator Beutler would move to amend with AM0134. (AM0134 appears on page 526 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Beutler, AM0134.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this amendment is a further narrowing amendment, hoping again to focus on a narrow class of employer who is involved in this situation. It deals strictly with Section 3 of the bill. If you'll look at Section 3 of the bill, you'll see that is a section that is independent from 2 and basically that's the section that requires employers in these large companies who are doing this recruiting practice to have a particular kind of statement, written statement executed. And what I want to do is to further narrow Section 3 to those companies whose work force is more than 10 percent non-English speaking employees who I think is the class that Senator Chambers most wants to address and involves the problem area in this particular situation. So it adds another limiting criteria to the bill to Section 3 to say that that statement is not going to be required except of those employers whose work force is more than 10 percent. So it adds another limiting criteria. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Once again we still the lights on that individuals wishing to address the bill, but they may wish to address the amendments so I'll go through that list.
