I guess that I also would like to know that he mentioned that Iowa, and, Senator Chambers, maybe you mentioned this, I didn't notice it, but I'd like to reiterate it, but that Iowa already has such a law on the books and this speaker said that they do not seem to be experiencing any great burden, the employers do not, in complying with their state law. Also, he said with respect to federal migrant ag worker laws you can again ask employers in that industry whether regulation has added a significant burden. Indeed, both Pioneer Seed and ICI Seed from Iowa have found that following the law and dedicating their corporation to doing so has produced a better and more stable work force and better results which said basically what I was trying to say earlier. I think that we're just beginning to see what has happened when we encourage low paying jobs in the state and I would like to suggest that anytime that we look at economic development legislation that we look at this aspect of it because we have burdened...

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...social services segment in this state in certain areas where there have been problems. We have burdened individual communities and I think that we need to think about that and take it all into account when we are looking at economic development legislation. Now maybe we'll find that even after we've looked at all that we still want those businesses in for other reasons, I doubt it, but in the long run the state is probably going to pay the price and that price is not always reflected in the figures that we see in fiscal notes. So with that I would just simply encourage you to move LB 20 to Select File.
