The community that I visited several times by invitation is Norfolk and a lot of the problems that were being addressed were created by the practices at the beef company, the packing plant. There were race problems, I say again, housing problems, many people stacked up in maybe a substandard dwelling because remember, there is an established high turnover. Where do the people go who lose these jobs or give them up? Since they cannot go home because they don't have the wherewithal, they stay in that community. Where do they live? They live with others who are willing to let them come in and stay with them and that's not even talking about the burdens on the churches, the social service agencies and others who are trying to help. With this disclosure statement that the bill requires a company is going to have to tell people, you'll be slicing bacon, you'll be lugging beef, you'll be on the beef kill, you'll be on the pork kill, you'll be in the hide cellar or any of the number of jobs that are considered very heavy, very dangerous, very unpleasant. If somebody's circumstances are so dire that they're willing to take a job like that, maybe I wish things were different, but I'm not in a position to say that person cannot take the job and there might be people willing to take these types of jobs even when told the nature of them but at least let the person be informed and the disclosure statement makes it clear. The company is not going to be able through misrepresentation to bring large numbers of people to substandard, dangerous, low-paying jobs which the company knows the persons will leave and let those people be dumped on the community. The community by not having regulation of this kind is forced to subsidized inappropriate behavior by profit-making companies. These are large operations and if they know that they can dump their problems on the community they will do it with human beings as some have fouled lakes, rivers and streams by dumping waste material where they should not. Human beings are not waste material, they should never be treated in that fashion. If, as I stated, the disclosure statement makes it clear the type of job that is available and the person takes it, there is less likelihood that that person is going to work for a very short time and leave because there was notice but even then if the person comes here and the job is so onerous, the pay so slight and so much taken out of their pay for the transportation and the substandard housing in which they live that they want to leave, the company has a responsibility. On the other hand the company cannot misrepresent that job and if in the statements
