

those people to understand what is taking place in the community and in the job that they're about to undertake and without that we're creating more problems for the neighborhoods, more problems for the communities, misunderstandings that are likely to take place, many of which could be avoided, many of which are being avoided because I really believe most of these employers are already doing this. So I don't think what Senator Chambers is proposing is anything that is going to be any additional cost or any real additional burden. It should be being done at this point and considering the number of people that are being brought into the area to work in these plants, certainly it's just a part of doing business, a part of doing business responsibly. Thank you very much.
