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SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Firsch. Senator Abboud, followed by Senator Hall.

SENATOR ABOUD: Waive off.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Abboud waives off. Senator Hall. Senator Hall waives off. No...Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: I would like to ask Senator Schellpeper a question if I may, please. Senator Schellpeper, the handout that you gave says that you're providing that security records, diagrams and specifications of lottery and its contractors are not subject to the open records law. Is that what is reflected on page 12, Section 8 in the addition?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's the committee amendments. We took that out so that they are subject to open records law.

SENATOR PREISTER: Okay, so they will be subject to the open meetings and open records laws.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR PREISTER: Okay, that was my concern.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's what the committee amendments are.

SENATOR PREISTER: Okay, good. Thank you for that clarification and I would also thank you for that addition because I think it is important that the public does have access, the public does have the opportunity particularly when there isn't a specific problem dealing with security and so that the public does have that information available to them.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you very much for that clarification.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Senator, the only thing that they don't want open to the public is the actual security cameras that they have and some of the other security things that they now have so that people don't know where they're at and how they operate, things like that. They think they have to have some internal security themselves in the operation. But the actual records
