PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Yes, you could, but you are talking about a brand area and not brand area. You know you get east of Grand Island, why you wouldn't have a brand then.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So the name would be better.

SENATOR JONES: The name would be better. You could use your initials, as far as that goes, but it should be permanently embedded because you wouldn't have the same initials as your neighbor right around you chances are. So initials would even be good, but it should be some lead sleeve or something that you could put it right in there on it.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senators. Senator Elmer.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Madam President. Senator Janssen has a good amendment. I believe that if you are going to be responsible for what you are doing, that this identification does need to be of a permanent nature so it is not easily removed or defaced, and would urge your acceptance of this amendment to Senator Lindsay's amendment. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Any further discussion on the amendment to the Lindsay amendment to LB 274? Seeing none, Senator Lindsay closes...waives closing. It is Monday morning. The question before the body is the adoption of the amendment to the Lindsay amendment to LB 274 All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on adoption of Senators Lindsay and Janssen's amendment to the Lindsay amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The amendment to the amendment is adopted. We return to a discussion of the Lindsay amendment, Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President, friends all. I just want to commend the body for working this out collaboratively. I think that the amendment that I had proposed
