

then after they multiply they tend to overlap and sometimes contradict one another and we get into this big mess and if we do the same thing with economic development, it will come to have a bad name just as our social welfare programs and welfare specifically today does not have a good name. And so what I am seeking to do is to clarify this program from the other programs that we have and be sure that the money in this program is used for that infrastructure kind of building that according to the introducers of the bill is what this bill is all about. So if I've correctly understood the bill, I think this should be a friendly and good amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Madam President. Senator Beutler, could I ask you a question?

SENATOR BEUTLER: After the word "grant".

SENATOR VRTISKA: May not receive more than one grant in any one year.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I don't think I'd have a problem with that if I understand what you're doing, yeah.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, I guess I need to get an amendment up there if you would not oppose it and make that change if there is no objections and as far as the rest of your amendment, I really don't have any problem with it. I think that I understand what you're trying to do and I guess I really don't have a big problem with it.
