

them notice that they're loitering and that you should not do that. be removed. If you don't you can be arrested. What this amendment does not do, it does not give arrest powers to the correctional officer. That's defined elsewhere in the statutes. All this would do is basically make it clear that a peace officer or correctional officer can notify somebody and tell them you're loitering outside the gate, to move along, to get away from the correctional complex and with that I'd urge the adoption of this amendment. It does not substantially change the bill, either greatly enhance it or restrict it. I think it's within the spirit of what was originally intended by LB 357 (sic) and I'd urge its adoption. Thank you.
