PRESIDENT ROBAK: There has been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, to go under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will all senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Will senators please check in. Senator Dierks, will you check in, please. Senator Cudaback, Senator Robinson, Senator Chambers and Senator Wesely. SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President, members, clearly the bill is going to go based on the last amendment but I do think it's poor public policy for us to single out one type of operation, that being a lottery contractor with the state for purposes of denying them the ability to make campaign contributions and that's what LB 28 does. I do very much want to, and that's not really the purpose for my standing up. My purpose for my standing up because I had forgotten to thank Senator Warner for laying the bill over since I was late because of a meeting in Omaha this morning, but while I was up I thought I'd take one last shot at the bill anyway, Jer. With that, I'm going to vote no just because I think it's bad policy and I understand it's got the votes to move. Thank you.
