SENATOR PIRSCH: So their work is not over, they require another two years?

SENATOR WARNER: Well, I made the comment, Senator Pirsch, at the hearing...this is about the sixth, seventh, eighth year I've had a bill revising the fuel tax and I made the comment that they ought...if, I'm not sure with term limits I can last enough long enough not to have to introduce a bill, but it is a complex area and many, you know, there's not been a lot of problems. Some of the problems have shown up, don't...you just do not anticipate them and this is...if there are inconveniences or things that it can be done better,...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR WARNER: ...it's to develop a system that will periodically review that and not just leave somebody out there that feels they're being unfairly treated in the lurch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Warner. And I do support this but I did have questions and I guess I can understand in the changes that are going on in our transportation area that, indeed, it is a complex area and probably needs some attention for the next two years. I support it. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Pirsch. Senator Bohlke, on the committee amendment.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Madam President, members, I have a question to ask Senator Warner. First, I want to thank him for bringing the committee amendments that do address certainly some concerns a number of us have from our constituents on the propane legislation. And I could have turned around and simply asked Senator Warner this question but I thought that those of you who have constituents may want to hear also. As I understand it, the Department of Revenue will notify those people of how they apply for their refund and I wanted to make sure will that be a direct mailing to the individuals, Senator Warner? Or how will...or do you know how that...how the Department of Revenue will handle that?
