

SENATOR WARNER: My understanding, Senator Bohlke, is that those vehicles that were registered in this fashion or paid the fixed fee are recorded as such with the Department of Motor Vehicles and then those addresses will be available to provide the refund form which will all be done through the Department of Revenue, not...the counties don't have to get involved. And all they will have to do is indicate on that form under "oath" as to what their estimate of the actual miles they did drive and if it's less than the 15,000, why they, obviously, would get then a proportionate refund. This does not happen till July 1 of this year so there are people yet today buying the fixed fee, so you would continue to get some comments. But last year, together with what they paid this year, will be refunded proportionate to their driving but it will be after July 1.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Senator Warner, and I certainly support this. And, again, I appreciate you addressing that because, as you said, for a number of people this amounts to a significant amount of money. So thank you very much.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Madam President and members of the body, could I ask Senator Warner a question or two?

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WAPNER: Sure. Yes.

SENATOR JONES: Yes, say I have a...using an example, if I have a propane pickup and go to the courthouse now, what would I be required to do?

SENATOR WARNER: Up until July 1st, you will continue to pay the fixed fee.

SENATOR JONES: And then after July 1,...

SENATOR WARNER: Then you will file...you will be notified, you will file...you will receive a form which you will file for a refund proportionate to the number of miles you drove in relation to that 15,000-mile average.

SENATOR JONES: Okay. Will I have to tell them anything at the courthouse that I've got an alternative fuel or anything then
