

after July 1?

SENATOR WARNER: After July 1, the only sticker that would be required is if you had an electric vehicle or a solar-powered or some vehicle that did not pay...

SENATOR JONES: But not a propane.

SENATOR WARNER: But propane, you would license it just like you do anywhere...like a gas or a diesel driven vehicle,...

SENATOR JONES: Yeah.

SENATOR WARNER: ...correct.

SENATOR JONES: Okay, then what about the propane dealer after July 1? They will have to sell it...they will have to charge the road tax on it when you come in for a fill.

SENATOR WARNER: After...the dealer, yes, the dealer will...the fuel that they sell at a pump they will, obviously, collect the tax. If it's delivered to a home, on a farm, if it's a separate tank for motor vehicles, they would...the tax would be paid at the time of delivery. If it was a single tank in which the individuals are filling both their car as well as heating their house, under that, the purchaser indicates what portion of the fuel...of the propane will be used for vehicles and what portion will be used for housing, and then they will pay the motor fuel tax on that portion or it will be collected, rather, and sales tax on the balance. The question has come up, and I...in response, the other two options that could have been used instead of having a person indicate, one, you could put on a separate metering unit that would fill your pickup. It's my understanding they run five, six hundred dollars, or you could put it in a separate tank and, as you well know, the cost of separate tanks are also significant compared to a diesel fuel tank because they're pressurized. So...but, in any event, they would only be paying on...the motor fuel tax on what they estimate they will be using in the motor vehicle.

SENATOR JONES: Well, the reason I asked, I've got a thousand-gallon tank on my ranch at home and I fill the...use it on the house, a tractor and a pickup, so the pickup would have to be separate.
