SENATOR BROMM: Sure.

SENATOR LYNCH: ...and if, in fact, to really accomplish that it's necessary to develop some language identifying or changing the document, I am more than willing to support that.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay, I'll visit with you about that between now and the next reading, so...

SENATOR LYNCH: Very good.

SENATOR BROMM: ...thank you. I just briefly do support the legislation. I think it does some of the things that are very favorable in terms of trying to automate and streamline the filing of records, which is so very important in all of our counties. And so thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Any further discussion on LB 288? Seeing none, Senator Lynch. Senator Lynch waives closing. The question is the advancement to E & R Initial of LB 288. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the advancement of LB 288. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 288.

SENATOR CROSBY: LB 288 advances. LB 386, Mr. Clerk.
