

discussion on the motion to advance to E & R Initial LB 452? Seeing none, Senator Warner to close.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, just briefly. We've had quite a bit of discussion. This is a significant change from what the practice has been for, I guess, a hundred and whatever number of years. And as you visit with some of your county people or others why we're certainly open to looking at some of these time frames, if there's a way to do it better. I assume that initially there will be some difficulty, because of time frame. But I think those difficulties are so outweighed by the greater likelihood of equity for individual property owners to appeal valuation, and what I suspect in the long run at least will narrow the range of values for like property within a county. And I would guess in a relatively short period of time, two or three years, we will find much greater equity of values between, particularly those governmental subdivisions that lie in two or more counties. And the age old problem of equalization of values will continue to exist, but I think it will be much less of a burden with this system than what the process permits now. With that, I'd ask that the bill be advanced.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Warner. You've heard the close, and the motion to advance LB 452 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
