

February 8, 1995 LB 49, 52, 127

Before we go on, Mr. Clerk, I'd like to announce some guests to the Legislature. Senator Crosby, in the north balcony, there are 60 seventh graders from Pound Junior High along with four teachers. Would you please stand and be recognized by the Legislature. Thank you for joining us today. What you're experiencing is what we call Final Reading. The Clerk may sound like he's mumbling a little bit or a lot, but we all have the Final Reading bills in front of us and can read along. It's a provision that's in the constitution, we're required to go through this. If you stay in the balcony for about another 15 or 20 minutes things will pick up a bit. Mr. Clerk, next bill.

CLERK: (Read LB 49 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR HALL: All provisions of law being complied with, the question is, shall LB 49e become law? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 653-54 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 5 excused and not voting.

SENATOR HALL: LB 49 passes with the emergency clause. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 52 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR HALL: All provisions of law being complied with, the question is, shall LB 52 become law? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 654-55 of the Legislative Journal.) 41 ayes, 1 nays, 1 present and not voting, 6 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: LB 52 becomes law. LB 127.

CLERK: (Read LB 127 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR HALL: All provisions of law being complied with, the question is, shall LB 127 pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 655 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 6 excused and not
