SENATOR HALL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 159 pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 656 of the Legislative Journal.) 40 ayes, 2 nays, 1 present and not voting, 6 excused and not voting.

SENATOR HALL: LB 159 passes. Next bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 161 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR HALL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 161 pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 656-57 of the Legislative Journal.) 45 ayes, 0 nays, 4 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: LB 161 passes. Next bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Bernard-Stevens would move to return the bill for specific amendment. The amendment is AM294. (Bernard-Stevens amendment to LB 202 appears on pages 657-58 of the Legislative Journal.)
