SENATOR HALL: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the committee amendments.

SENATOR HALL: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Lindsay, to open on the bill.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. President, and members, I explained the bill on the committee amendments, fairly straightforward. It simply allows a...now with the committee amendments a garnishee may make the check payable to the judgment creditor rather than to the court. If that occurs, the check would be forwarded by the court then to the judgment creditor rather than having the court hold the check for a period...number of days while the initial check clears then reissuing another check. So, with that, I would be happy to try to answer any questions. Would urge advancement of the bill.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Is there any discussion on the motion to advance LB 420 to E & R Initial? Seeing none, Senator Lindsay waives closing. The question is the advancement of LB 420 to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the advancement of LB 420.
