

SENATOR HALL: ...11 is a teachers' retirement fund association; 12 is a benevolent life insurance association; cemetery company is 13, they don't need to worry much about lawful products being used; a credit union without capital stock is 14; insurance companies or associations, other than life companies, would have a certain limited number of net premiums; corporations, farmers and fruit growers, a cooperative, is 16; a trust or trust performing under a nondiscriminatory plan. I mean, many of these I don't have any problem with. It is not a...I mean, it even has 22, Senator Preister, condominium and residential real estate management association. I mean, folks who wanted to be exempted would have that ability. A political organization is 23; title-holding company is 25; war veterans organizations post is 19.

SENATOR WILL: Time.

SENATOR HALL: There's any number of groups that would fall under this category. But to open it up by stripping nonprofit out of there just makes it wide open and basically defeats the purpose of the bill.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Senator Hall. Senator Chambers, on the first divided portion of the Priester amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I have to ask Senator Hall a question. Senator Hall, I've been otherwise occupied, which part of the amendment is being discussed now?

SENATOR WILL: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Chambers, it's the striking of a nonprofit.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right. Members of the Legislature, I have discussed this provision with Senator Hall and I agree with him that it should not be stricken. First of all, the idea is to allow citizens, in the language of the bill, to make use of these legal products off the premises of the employer during nonworking hours so long as the use of those products will have no effect on how the employee does his or her job, so long as it's not one of these nonprofits which does the things that the bill mentions.
