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SENATOR HALL: And my concern is this. I understand, I would like frankly to have smoking rooms throughout the capitol if we were going to take this approach, but the concern is that under the amendment we would be required to designate a room, it would have to be ventilated, and my guess in order to comply with the ADA, it would probably have to be on either the first or second floor because those are really the only two rooms, excuse me, only two levels of the building that are completely accessible.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I would suspect you're right, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Is this...when you talked with the Director of DAS, as I continue to fight him for space, is this something that he is going to take out of our office space or does he have a place already designated that he thinks will work for this area?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I don't know that either, but I can try to find out for you.

SENATOR HALL: I'd appreciate it because space in this building is a major concern, especially on the first two levels and I would agree with your assessment that very likely if we were to do this it would probably have, if we're going to allow for smoking in the building, I would think the room in which we allowed it would have to be accessible and I would sure hope that it would be. But my concern again is just that if we're going to do this, we're going to do it in this fashion, there ought to be designated areas like we currently have. I think that the system that we current...and thank you very much, Senator Schimek, I appreciate that. The way we currently have the building set up with smoking areas I believe works well. If you want to smoke you basically go to those designated areas in order to smoke. Many people still go outside. Senator Robinson is right, that I still do light up a stogie from time to time and the only time Senator Will lights one up is if I give him one, because he doesn't buy his own. The question here is for purposes of our policy as it relates to state buildings, who do we allow exemptions for? We started out with the university as I understood the bill. We allowed for Game and Parks to have some areas that are exempt. We allowed for, I believe, if I'm not mistaken, the Department of Public Institutions to have exemptions and at present we're working on the Capitol Building. So in other words we're going to say that there are places...our policy is that we don't want smoking in public buildings except
