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would have no reason for going into a designated smoking room. There would be some expense to it, there's no question about that and again, DAS has mentioned that it would probably cost about \$5,000 or more. They did, Senator Hall, they did mention in our discussion, the discussion with my staff, they did mention first or second floor so I think they are thinking about accessibility. They did not have any particular room in mind so I assume that there would have to be some juggling if that were to happen. Once again, I introduced this as a compromise position. I did vote against sending the bill to the floor although I think it's a good bill and basically overall I support it, but I think there needs to be some consideration of those of our citizens who are smokers and without infringing upon the space, if you will, of those who are nonsmokers. So with that I would simply ask for your approval of this amendment and, Mr. Speaker, I'm going to suggest that we may have to have a call of the house.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Was that a suggestion or a request?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: A request.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The request has been made. The question is, shall the house go under call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Members, return to your desk. Unauthorized parties please leave the floor. Please check in. Members off the floor, please return, the house is under call. Members, please check and check in, the house is under call. Senator Vrtiska, please check in. Senators Pedersen, Bernard-Stevens and Lindsay, please return. Senator Chambers, Senator Cudaback, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Hartnett, Senator Wesely. Senators Hartnett, Pedersen and Schellpeper. Senator Schellpeper and Hartnett. I understand Senator Hartnett is on his way. We still have not been able to locate Senator Schellpeper. Senator Schimek has authorized us to go ahead. The question is the adoption of the Schimek amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the amendment.
