PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. The question before the body is the adoption of the Bernard-Stevens amendment to LB 121. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Senator.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Request a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There's been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will all senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Will senators please check in. Senator Witek and Senator Jensen, will you check in, please. Senator Maurstad, will you check in, please. Senator Bromm, Senator Chambers, Senator Hillman. Senator Landis. Senator Robinson. Senator Bromm, Senator Chambers and Senator Hillman. We are waiting for Senator Hillman. There's been a request for a roll call vote. Please proceed, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 735-36 of the Legislative Journal.) 10 ayes, 24 nays on the adoption of Senator Bernard-Stevens' amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Bernard-Stevens amendment fails. I raise the call. Mr. Clerk, is there anything further on the bill?

ASSISTANT CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is there any further discussion of LB 121? Seeing none, Senator Preister, do you wish to close?

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President, friends all. Yes, I do wish to close and I thank you. I appreciate the dialogue, the discussion. At this time I would ask for a call of the house because I think I'm going to need all of those votes before I close.
