SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. Speaker, I'll withdraw the amendment at this time and reserve the right to reintroduce this amendment if Senator Chambers' amendment is adopted.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Okay, fine, thank you, Senator Maurstad, we appreciate that. I think that is with the understanding that the Maurstad amendment will probably be reconsidered at a future time on this bill, but that we'll now proceed with the Chambers' amendment and give people an opportunity to examine the Maurstad amendment. So we are now back to a discussion of the underlying Chambers amendment and, Senator Maurstad, your light is on. Senator Schrock, would you like to speak on the Chambers amendment.
