SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Chambers, you are recognized to close on the amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I believe the amendment has been thoroughly discussed and explained and I want to tailgate on what Senator Bromm said about the way this bill will be enforced through the activities of the Department of Labor. First of all, I'm going to presume that a department of government and its director will behave in a way that is reputable and in conformity with the statute. Any statute that we enact could have portions where reasonable people could disagree. If they begin to enforce through their activities this bill in a way with which I disagree, then I would talk to them and they would have to satisfy me as to why they are doing what they are doing if I disagree with it. I do not want this bill to be a basis for padding an employment roll or anything else at the department. And I've had discussions and some things have been reduced to writing in terms of what I expect in the way of enforcement of this bill, not where I gave a laundry list of things that you shall do this, you shall not do that, but the idea that we have a problem that the bill is to address. Anything that we have put in this bill is aimed at solving that problem. Any enforcement actions by the Department of Labor have to be for the purpose of making sure that the provisions we put in the bill are being complied with based on what our very extensive legislative history will show our collective intent is. I believe the people over there at the department understand, I believe they're going to do the right thing, but there are 49 of us who can carry on oversight if such is necessary. I hope that you will adopt this amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
